### Food Vendors – Rules & Regulations

The Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village presents the history of Ukrainian settlement in East Central Alberta from 1892 to 1930. In presenting the pioneering experiences of Ukrainian settlement in East Central Alberta, the site employs a “living history” approach so that visitors can experience history in a very direct and personal way. In addition to regular programming at the site, Special Events are organized to highlight the village at certain times of the year.

### Goals/Objectives

To enhance Special Events, food vendors are invited to complement the offerings of the Friends of the Ukrainian Cultural Village Society’s food services. The criteria for participation as a food vendor are: **those food and beverage items to be sold should not conflict or enter into direct competition with those sold by the Kalyna Food Court and Friends Diner (see menus on the FOUVS website).** It is at the discretion of the Executive Director of the Friends Society or the Director of Food Services to reject a vendor that does not meet the criteria or does not abide by the conditions outlined below. ### Food Vendors will receive:

- Two free gate admissions on the market day when they will be participating.
- The ability to establish their own individual prices.

### Market Vendors will be required to:

- Complete the food vendor application form.
- Provide your own cooking equipment and utensils, food condiments, serving dishes and accessories, and manpower.
- Provide your food permit with their application if required by the Alberta Health Services. The Vendor must at all times comply with all rules and regulations of the show and all laws (municipal, provincial, federal, fire and health) and are required to meet health food standards as per the Alberta Food Regulations and Public Health Act.
- Carry Comprehensive General Liability Insurance and be liable for all loss, damage, injury, claim cost and expenses caused by any person or property in any circumstances by the vendor. The Friends of the Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village shall not be

responsible for any loss, theft or damage to the property of the vendor, employees or representatives.

- Be set up to open by 9:00 AM at Special Events and should not remove their items from the market before 4:30 PM. Please contact the Friends if you require equipment to be dropped off prior to the event.
- Be professional in their appearance, the appearance of their booth (including their products, bags, trucks, etc.), and the way in which they conduct themselves onsite.☒
- Leave their sites clean and in good condition.
- Sell items other than those available from the Kalyna Food Court and Village Sweets & Treats except on Ukrainian Day and Harvest of the Past.
- Dress accordingly for the weather.
- Contact (780) 662 – 3855 Ext. 1164 at least 5 days in advance if they wish to cancel.
- In the event of bad weather, contact the Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village to determine whether the Special Event will be running as scheduled.

**General rules include:**

- All visitors must park their vehicles in the public parking lot after items have been unloaded.
- The consumption of alcoholic beverages on site is strictly prohibited. Vendors are not permitted to sell or provide free samples of alcoholic beverages to the attending public. This includes beer, wine, or hard liquor.
- Animals are not permitted onsite.
- Smoking is not permitted in the vicinity of the Village Market.
